Secures Major Glasscock Grant for Fall Symposium & Small Conference

On May 5, 2025, Dr. ArCasia James-Gallaway (Department of Teaching, Learning, and Culture) received a \$12,000 Symposium and Small Conference Grant from the Melbern G. Glasscock Center for Humanities Research.

The funding will support her symposium, “Black and Indigenous Histories of Education: Reflexivity, Oral History, and Archival Research Practice in Canada and the United States.” Glasscock Center Director Dr. Troy Bickham noted that the peer-review committee praised both the strength of her proposal and her ability to successfully execute the project.

The symposium will be held on Tuesday, September 9, 2025, 9:00 AM–4:00 PM, in Room 311 of the Glasscock Center (305 Glasscock Building, 4214 TAMU, College Station, TX 77843). Dr. James-Gallaway will convene seven leading Black and Indigenous women scholars from the U.S. and Canada to share oral-history methods, community-based research practices, and archival approaches that foreground historically marginalized voices.
